Class 6 have another busy and exciting half term of learning and activities planned. We are enjoying our theme on ‘Town and Country’ and this half term the focus is on town and city life.

Our art sessions are traffic and wheel based. The students will explore different media and create: wheel spoke weaving mobiles; paper plate wheel whirlers; salad spinner paintings; marble/ball rolling ‘friendship’ paintings. Our vocational and enterprise cookery sessions are also traffic themed as we develop our skills making: traffic light stuffed peppers and frittata; savoury cheese and samosa spiced pin wheels.

At Foxglove Covert we will continue to develop our ‘volunteer’ skills working alongside the community team based there. This work supports and contributes towards our DofE award. We are also developing our craft and literacy skills and interests based upon the book ‘The Stick Man’ by Julia Donaldson in the onsite classroom. Forest School and RDA also continue to offer us some great off site and on site outdoor learning opportunities. During these sessions we are developing our workplace skills and ASDAN unit accreditation on ‘Caring for animals’ by looking after and playing with Maud the dog and grooming/cleaning out the ponies.

Our vocational and careers programme continues with Scone Shop. We are introducing a new ordering system both paper and electronic version in the café using symbols and numerals to support in being more independent when taking customer orders.
